


palimpsest noun | PAL-imp-sest

Definition:

- 1 : writing material (such as a parchment or tablet) used one or more times after earlier writing has been erased
- 2 : something having usually diverse layers or aspects apparent beneath the surface

Did You Know?

Long ago, writing surfaces were so rare that they were often used more than once. Palimpsest originally described an early form of recycling in which an old document was erased to make room for a new one when parchment ran short. (The word is from the Greek palimpsestos, meaning "scraped again.") Fortunately for modern scholars, the erasing process wasn't completely effective, so the original could often be distinguished under the newer writing. De republica, by Roman statesman and orator Cicero, is one of many documents thus recovered from a palimpsest. Nowadays, the word palimpsest can refer not only to such a document but to anything that has multiple layers.

Also in attendance was our Shire President Cr Keith Dunlop and Chief Bush Fire Control Officer Rod Daw, Hopetoun Police, Ravensthorpe Fire and Rescue, Hopetoun Volunteer Marine Rescue, Hopetoun Rural Bush Fire Brigade, Hopetoun Volunteer Fire and Emergency Services, Ravensthorpe SES and Parks and Wildlife Services.

These meetings strengthen relationships between government agencies and volunteer crews that potentially could be working together to respond to emergencies or major incidents.

Being actively engaged in such an organisation with fantastic like-minded people brings great pride. There are many mentors within the Hopetoun and Ravensthorpe team whom I really respect. "I have been an active member of St John Ambulance for the last 3 years. I joined as I have an interest in giving back to the community, and with numbers at the time quite low I felt it was my time to make a commitment. Training is great - we have a laugh, learn and refine skills that are not only essential to our role but beneficial in our everyday lives. As a volunteer you put in as much as you can, and our sub centres are very understanding (60 hours per year is not hard) and you can progress from an Emergency Medical Responder (EMR), to an Emergency Medical Assistant (EMA), then onto an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT). I volunteer in Hopetoun, Ravensthorpe and Munglinup due to where we live. I have recently completed my EMT, which enables me to provide the highest level of care to our patients. I love the feeling of being able to assist people when they really need it, and it's very gratifying to receive an appreciative heartfelt thanks. "When I joined as a volunteer with St John Ambulance I was going through a rough patch in my life, I was pretty lost and looking for a way to feel like I belonged to my community. PREPARING FOR STORMS

STORM SEASON

Storms may bring heavy rain, damaging winds, lightning, hail, floods and tornados to the southern half of Western Australia between May and October each year. However storms can occur during the warmer months so it is important to stay prepared all year round.

WHAT IS A STORM?

Storms develop when warm, humid air near the ground is pushed rapidly upward into an unstable atmosphere.

WHY PREPARE FOR STORMS?

Damaging winds, flash floods, lightning, hail and tornados can cause damage to homes, cars and the environment. They can even cause injury or loss of life.

Most storm damage to homes occurs from:

- loose and broken roof materials
- fallen trees and branches
- flooding from blocked gutters and downpipes

People can stay safe and reduce damage to their homes by being prepared.

HOW TO PREPARE

Preparing your family and home for a storm is your responsibility. If you live in a storm prone area, you should make it a priority between March and May to get your home ready inside and out. There are a few simple steps that could help you minimise damage:

- Check your roof and gutters for damage or loose material
- Clear gutters and downpipes of leaves and blockages
- Trim branches near your home and hire a contractor to clear trees from powerlines
- Clear rubbish from your yard, balcony or patio and put away any loose objects
- Prepare an emergency kit with portable radio, torch, spare batteries, first aid kit and family emergency plan
- Ensure your family understand storms and the risks
- Prepare an emergency plan including a relocation plan in case your home becomes flooded. Consider what you will do with your pets and know how to turn off the gas, electricity and water supplies (refer to the DFES website for more information)
- Display a list of emergency phone numbers
- Check you have adequate home and contents insurance

WEATHER WARNINGS

You can keep up to date with latest storm warnings and advice:

- through news bulletins on radio, TV or online
- on the DFES website www.dfes.wa.gov.au
- on the Bureau of Meteorology's website www.bom.gov.au or by calling their Land Weather Warnings and Flood Warnings Advice Line on **1300 659 213**

WHEN A STORM IS FORECAST

- Secure or remove loose material and rubbish from around your home or work because strong winds during storms can turn loose items into potentially deadly missiles
- Weigh down loose objects using plastic bags filled with sand, rather than bricks that can be blown around in strong wind
- Ensure your emergency kit is up to date
- Ensure your pets and animals are in a safe area
- Move your vehicles under cover
- If you are away from your home you should contact family or friends to ensure your home is secure
- Construction site workers should put away any loose building material and secure their sheds
- Boat owners should make sure their boats are securely moored
- Campers should find alternative shelter

Special food and medication may be required for infant, elderly or disabled family members

Volunteer ambulance officers receive the highest quality training which equips them with the essential basic and intermediate life support skills to assist them in stabilising patients en route to hospital.

In addition to the initial training, an ongoing skills maintenance program for volunteers is also provided at the local sub center's, either Ravensthorpe or Hopetoun, in cooperation with the regional training coordinator.

St John Volunteers can also undertake other training courses, including volunteer skills weekends, a volunteer ambulance officer driving course, a skills knowledge and ongoing continuing education program.

Esperance State Barrier Fence

Final environmental approvals have been cleared to commence work on the State Barrier Fence - Esperance extension from June 2019. The 660km fence extension will assist farmers in Ravensthorpe and Esperance to combat wild dog predation on livestock.

The start of the project will focus on upskilling Esperance Tjaltjraak traditional owners to complete 8km of fencing works. The State Government has allocated \$6.9 million towards the whole project, with the Shires of Esperance and Ravensthorpe, as well as the Federal Government allocating funding to the project.

The Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development (DPIRD) proposes to extend the State Barrier Fence eastwards from its current termination point near Ravensthorpe, extending north around Salmon Gums and terminating east of Esperance near Cape Arid National Park.

Once complete, it is estimated that the extended fence will allow landholders in the area managed by the Esperance Biosecurity Association to increase current stocking rates by 40 percent.

The project forms part of a \$18.6 million Wild Dog Action Plan to help protect and revitalise WA's pastoral and agricultural industries announced in November 2017. This package was in addition to the nearly \$10 million allocated to Recognised Biosecurity Groups for wild dog control and for other DPIRD wild dog related expenditure

Samuel Newman, organised by Ravensthorpe Regional Arts Council, delivers an electronic music production program for people of all ages and was skilled in engaging and directing all students of varying abilities to gain confidence in using a range of instruments to contribute to a song.

After having a bash and making a racket on each of the instruments, children formed two groups, focussed on the background beat and experimented with creating rhythm and something that transformed into a sound pleasing to the ears!

With a two-hour session of recording, Sam then went away to splice the best pieces of work into a bespoke Jerdacuttup Primary School sound.

Students are very enthusiastic about the prospect of a return visit from Sam later in the year to have ready their own lyrics to build into a song. If all goes well they will also storyboard

The map itself is downloaded and stored on your phone so that no mobile reception is required in the field. This is important, as for a lot of rural Australia, mobile reception is either poor or non-existent.

The phone's GPS enables the display of your location on the map at all times using a satellite-based system - so does not rely on mobile reception either.

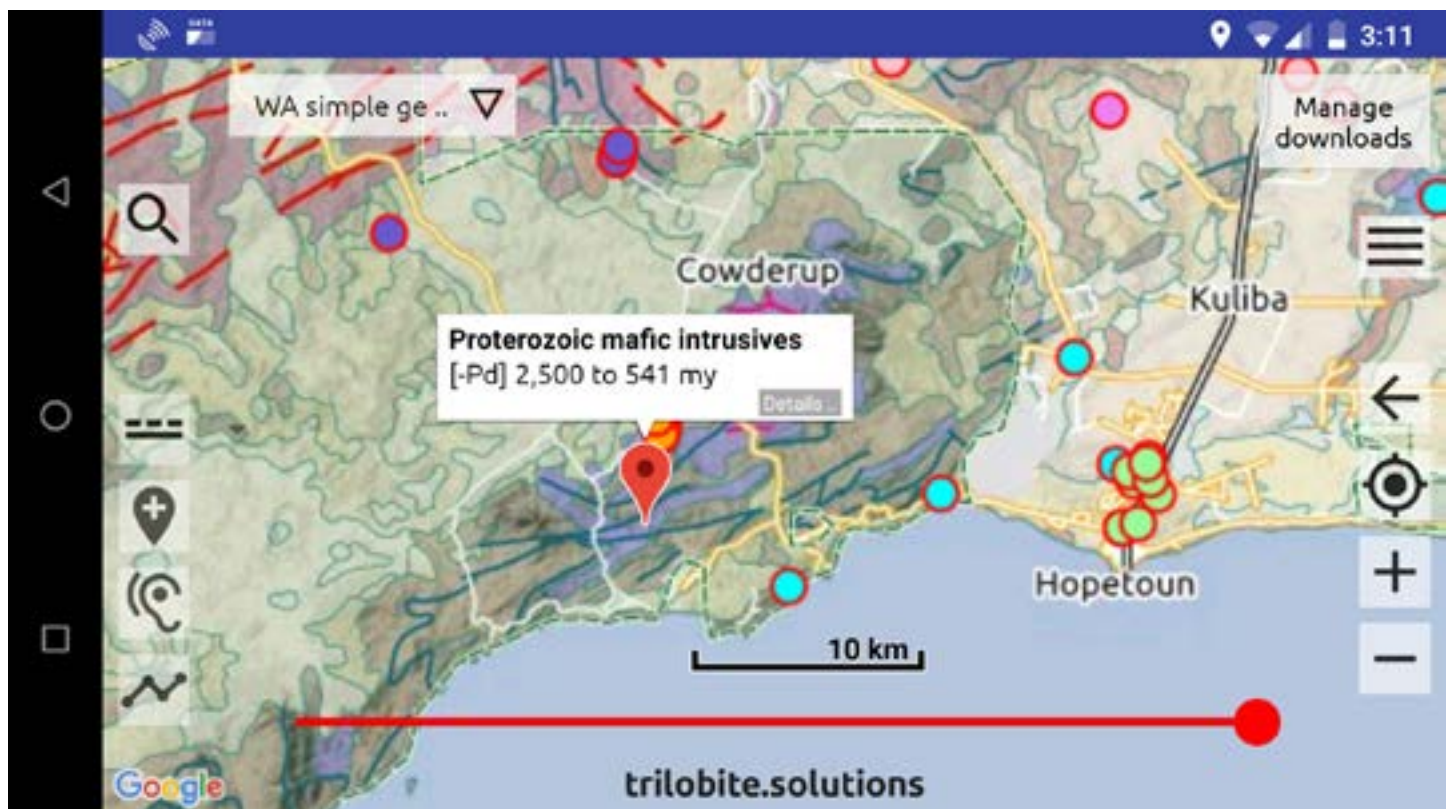
The user can centre the map at their current location, allowing them to determine the geology under their feet - or of nearby features. All geology maps include roads, rivers, towns, geographic places, bush-walking tracks and importantly, shaded relief highlighting geological structures.

In addition to this, facts about rock units are displayed. When a user touches the phone screen, a pop-up reveals the rock unit name and age, and then detailed information is shown if the pop-up itself is touched. You can also tap a button to have your phone speak to you, reporting the geology whenever you cross a geological boundary, as you drive.

Esperance Indoor Sports Stadium breaks ground

Construction of the Esperance Indoor Sports Stadium officially commenced last week, with a sod-turning ceremony.

The construction tender was awarded to Esperance-based building company, Sime Construction. The new multi-sports facility will have an impressive 75 percent local content component, supporting the local construction sector and jobs in the region.

The \$8.36 million project, funded jointly by the State Government and the Shire of Esperance, also includes upgrades to the Noel White Pavilion.

The stadium's construction is expected to take 12 months.

The new facility is set to replace the ageing existing indoor sports stadium, providing a long-term home for local indoor sports as well as events such as the Esperance and Districts Agricultural Show.
