Volunteers learn new skills in Albany

On Thursday May 9th a group of Ravensthorpe and Hopetoun St John Ambulance volunteers travelled to Albany to be trained in Major Incident Medical Management Support (MIMMS).

MIMMS Australasia is an internationally recognised course that has been developed from the UK MIMMS course and adapted to suit the needs of the Australian disaster management system. It teaches a systematic and practical approach to field medical management at disasters.













Our amazing and dedicated volunteers took time out of their busy lives to participate in this training which will undoubtedly benefit the whole community. The training was delivered by the West Australian Country Health Service (WACHS) and over 20 country ambulance volunteers from across the region were granted places to take part.

The day was spent learning about management systems, scene control and the role of the ambulance service within a disaster event. Participants reinforced knowledge gained through local training and experience, explored a myriad of possible scenarios and had to think on their feet in practical exercises. They were challenged and supported in an engaging learning environment to put their skills and knowledge to the test and work as a team.

Ravensthorpe Court:

Below are the results from the Ravensthorpe Court, held 28 May 2018:

- Danielle Erin Barnes was convicted of 'Drive Under the Influence of Alcohol,' fined \$2,400, and her driver's license was suspended for life.
- Lindsay Wayne Moffatt was convicted of 'Drive With a Blood Alcohol Content Exceeding 0.05%,' fined \$600, and his license was suspended for eight months.
- Steven Hoheia Rogers was convicted of 'Drive With a Blood Alcohol Content Exceeding 0.05%' and 'No Authority to Drive,' and was fined a total of \$500.

Family Violence:

One of the most important priorities of the Western Australia Police Force is contributing to the prevention of, and combatting, family violence. In fact, family violence contributes to a large proportion of our overall workload. When police suspect family violence has occurred, we have a duty to investigate, regardless of the concerns of any person, and we respond with the intention of supporting victims and holding perpetrators accountable.

Many people may not be aware of the exhaustive list of what constitutes family violence. It is far more than physical violence. Police rely on the definition of family violence in the Restraining Orders Act 1997, which includes, and is not limited to:

- Assault

- Sexual assault or other sexually abusive behaviour
- Stalking or cyber stalking
- Repeated derogatory remarks
- Damaging property
- Causing death or injury to an animal that is the property of the family member
- Unreasonably denying the family member financial autonomy
- Unreasonably withholding financial support
- Preventing the family member from making or keeping connections with the member's family, friends or culture
- Kidnapping, or depriving the liberty of, the family member
- Distributing an intimate image of the family member without the family member's consent, or threatening to distribute the image
- Causing any family member who is a child to be exposed to behaviour referred to in this section.

Victims of family violence will have the full support of police, and perpetrators will be subject to all measures to hold them accountable and prevent recurrence.

Barrier fence launch a huge success

Construction of the Esperance Extension of the State Barrier Fence commenced on May 23rd 2019.

This momentous occasion was launched by the Minister for Regional Development; Agriculture and Food; Ports; the Honourable Alannah MacTiernan driving in the first fence post.

Work on the first 8.5 kilometres has commenced with the Esperance Tjaltjraak Aboriginal Rangers being upskilled in fencing by Department of Primary Industries and Regional Development Staff.

The fence launch was followed by a luncheon at the Jerdacuttup Hall.

Southern Biosecurity Group Chair Karyn Tuckett addressed the luncheon and spoke about her own experiences as a wool grower.

"Wild dogs impact more than the economy. They have significant emotional and social impacts. Construction of the fence will extend the protection and certainty that much of the state already experiences to our corner of the world."

Mrs Tuckett also acknowledged the significant contributions that many have made to the project.

"This project has been one that has involved many people over a number of years. I'd like to thank those that have been involved and

supported this project, both within Ravensthorpe and Esperance shires.

"You have made a huge commitment to the success of this project through your perseverance, along with your donation of time and skills. Southern Biosecurity Group has been proud to support this project, with wild dogs recognised as a key biosecurity threat to our shire."

Ann Williams from the Ravensthorpe Historical Society put together an excellent display of the State Barrier Fence and showcased information relating to the original rabbit proof fence.

Southern Biosecurity Group would also like to thank the Jerdacuttup P&C for providing catering on the day.

Construction of the Esperance Extension of the State Barrier Fence could only be possible with the financial support of the following:

- State Government - \$6.9 million

- Australian Government - \$1.95 million
- Australian Wool Innovation Ltd. has provided \$205,000 in fencing machinery via a free three year lease to DPIRD.

The entire 660 kilometres of the fence is expected to take around 2.5 years to complete.

Advance Notice of Road Works on South Coast Highway, near Munglinup

Main Roads will soon commence works on two bridges on South Coast Highway, near the Munglinup town-site.

The Oldfield River Bridge is approximately 20km west of Munglinup and requires maintenance and structural repairs.

The Munglinup River Bridge is approximately 2km east of Munglinup and will be refurbished with a widened concrete deck, new safety barrier and some structural repairs.

These works will occur concurrently **from mid-June 2019** for approximately 12 weeks. Traffic management and speed restrictions will be in place and, traffic will be reduced to one lane near the work site. Road users are encouraged to plan ahead and allow extra time for their journey.

WAFarmers Livestock President, David Slade backed the minister's position, that the last-minute attempt to stop the shipment only causes more chaos, and potentially jeopardises future animal welfare issues for the sheep currently waiting in quarantine at the feedlot.

"What these groups need to realise is that the industry has adopted all the necessary

measures required by the government," Mr Slade said.

"It's clear these groups will go to any length to see the industry stopped. We have seen this before with the cash for cruelty scandal that is currently under investigation.

"To ensure this does not happen again we would like to see the government treat the claims of the activists with far more skepticism, as they have

lost all shreds of credibility with this latest attempt to stop the shipment.

"From now on the regulator should only accept scientifically backed data with real evidence from credible organisations," Mr Slade said.

WAFarmers look forward to the new government setting new standards for the regulators to apply the common-sense rule, when clearly being played by activist organisations.

■ SOUTHERN BIOSECURITY GROUP

Recent control activities for the drooping prickly pear have shown the impact that the introduction of cochineal has had on the species.

Cochineal is a small bug that feeds specifically on prickly pear by sucking out the moisture and nutrients from the plant. The bug is also used to produce the cochineal colour used in food dyes and cosmetics.

Southern Biosecurity Group Chair Mrs Karyn Tuckett said, "We've been very lucky to be able to use cochineal to supplement our chemical control activities. This has meant that in some areas we have been able to treat plants immediately with chemical, but also in other areas we've been able to establish populations of this insect to ensure longer term control of any re-emerging plants".

"We really appreciate the investment from our funding providers that has enabled us to continue these works. Ongoing control is critical to the success of weed control programs," said Mrs Tuckett.

Due to its environmental, social and economic impacts prickly pear is a weed of national significance. It has the potential to outcompete many native species as well as provide a harbour for other ferals like foxes and rabbits. Fruit fly are also drawn to the fruit, making control of prickly pear an important consideration in fruit fly control programs.

This work has been funded through the Department of Primary Industries



and Regional Development's Coordination Cactus Control Program and the Regional Land Partnerships initiative of the National Landcare Program through funding from the Ravensthorpe Agricultural Initiative Network and South Coast Natural Resource Management. Introduction of the cochineal was funded through the State Natural Resource Management Program.

Farming News**RAIN News...****RAIN Seedling delivery & planting notes**

All our Kwongan seedlings for 2019 are allocated. Thanks to those that have been in touch.

For those receiving native seedlings from RAIN, we are expecting their delivery 20-21st June. We have not secured a date for the saltbush deliveries as yet.

The below information is a best practice reminder.

Please note seedlings must be:

- transported in a covered vehicle or trailer;
- watered daily until planted;
- planted into a weed free environment;
- wet when planted;
- planted DEEP—very importantly to ensure more than one third of the plant length (including the leaves) is buried below the soil surface—the stem and leaves will NOT rot if buried (as long as there are some leaves sticking out the top the plant will be okay).

Remove seedlings from their tray with care—either pulling from the base of the stem or poking the tray base.

If you have received seedlings via RAIN and do not need the full allocation we would appreciate any leftovers be returned to our office so they can be redistributed.

A condition of receiving seedlings via RAIN is that staff can come onto the property post-planting to inspect their success and to take photos and GPS coordinates for reporting purposes.

Trays come at a cost and must be returned to the RAIN Office so we can return them to the nursery for next season's planting.

This project is supported by funding from the Western Australian Government's State NRM Program and supported by Royalties for Regions, and South Coast NRM via the Australian Government's National Landcare Programme.

This will be the fourth time we have done this monitoring.

Our first two sessions were successful in that dibblers were trapped, weighed, measured, microchipped and released.

Our last session in October 2018 didn't return any dibblers, due almost certainly to the very dry conditions prevailing.

As this situation has not changed it's only fair to warn you that in my view we are unlikely to trap dibblers. However it's always nice to be out in the Fitz. And I'm

National On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme

The Australian and Western Australian governments are working together to deliver \$4.6 million in national rebates to livestock farmers and pastoralists in rural Western Australia for on-farm water infrastructure.

The National On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme is available to eligible commercial livestock farmers and pastoralists in rural WA.

The rebate is for 25% up to a maximum of \$25 000 for the purchase of new water infrastructure, delivery and installation to address animal welfare needs and improves resilience to drought.

Eligible items include water storage devices such as tanks and troughs, pipes, fittings and pumps associated with water distribution systems, new bores and the desilting of dams by a contractor.

Rebates can be applied to costs incurred after June 30th 2018, and applications close April 30th, 2021 or when the funding allocation is exhausted, whichever occurs first.

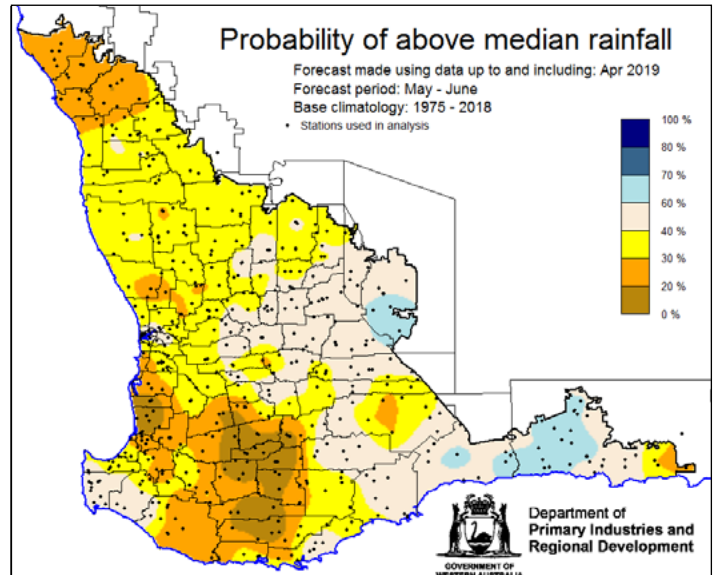

SSF Predicts Drier than Normal Season

DPIRD's Statistical Seasonal Forecast (SSF) for the next three months has an overall prediction of a drier than normal season, with some variable predictions for different regions.

The SSF indicates the chances of exceeding median rainfall between May and July is less than average (40 per cent) in the northern and southern grainbelt, more favourable (60 per cent) in the far eastern areas and the shires of Ravensthorpe and Esperance, and neutral (40-60 per cent) elsewhere.

What does this map mean?

Statistical forecasts are not for exact amounts. They take the form of probability distributions that may represent a shift from historical rainfall probabilities.

The probability of above median rainfall map shows the chance of getting more rainfall than usual, when compared to the years in the base climatology.

The best way to visualise what this means is to click on a station for more detail. Stations shown in black are from the Patchpoint database. Stations shown in white are DPIRD automatic weather stations.

For a general overview, see the Seasonal Climate Outlook newsletter. It provides a dot point summary of seasonal rainfall and other climate forecasts made by DPIRD and other national and international organisations.

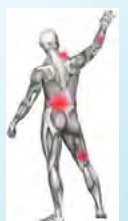

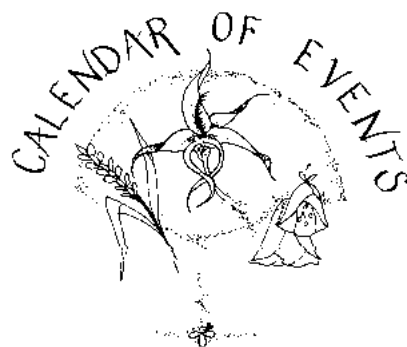
