Emergency Services hone their skills

On Thursday evening we joined forces with Ravensthorpe Volunteer Fire and Rescue Services in our first multi agency Combined Emergency Services Training for 2019.

A few months ago four of our volunteers headed across to Albany to be trained in MIMMS (Major Incident Medical Management Support). As a result of our training we have decided to roll out bi-monthly training within the Shire of Ravensthorpe working with all Emergency Services Crews.

The simulated exercise was a Motor Vehicle Accident, car versus tree, at 7:00pm, located on Masons Bay Road, Jerdacuttup. We had four patients, three were trapped in the vehicle and one walking wounded.

We had a team of five Department of Fire and Emergency Services WA volunteers, Ash, Luke, Noise, Chris and Ollie.

Ten volunteer ambulance officers turned out which formed three teams. Our first crew was Kylie, Alice and

Karina, the second crew was Stacey, David and Chloe and the third crew was Geoff, Bell and Kellie. The crews were overseen by our Community Paramedic Michelle and the scene was overseen by Holly.

Our Ambulance Officers used a variety of skills including traction splint, collars, spinal precautions, dressings, spine board, head blocks, log rolls, medications, manual handling and patient reassurance skills.

higgledy-piggledy adverb | hig-ul-dee-PIG-ul-dee

Definition:

: in a confused, disordered, or random manner

Did You Know?

We really have no idea where higgledy-piggledy came from, but we do know it's a perfect demonstration of English speakers' fondness for reduplication—that is, for forming new words by repetition of a base word often with a slight change of sound. In this case, the base word might actually be the second term, which encompasses the word pig and calls to mind the association of pigs with disorderliness. Although we don't know when exactly higgledy-piggledy first appeared in print, we do know that the word has been around since before 1600. John Florio's *A Worlde of Wordes*, an English-Italian dictionary first published in 1598, used higgledy-piggledy as a defining term for the Italian word *alla rinfusa*, along with two other examples of reduplication, *pell-mell* and *helter-skelter*.

Interregional Dance Showcase

■ RRAC

Celebrating the end of 'RRAC Dance', a project that has saturated a remote WA region with contemporary dance, the Interregional Dance Showcase was a multi-art performance event, supported by the CBH Grass Roots. Co-created by The Ravensthorpe Regional Arts Council (RRAC) and Talitha Maslin, it saw budding young dancers from the region take the stage.

The RRAC Dance project was a pilot program conceived by the Ravensthorpe Regional Arts Council, which placed a resource in a remote regional network of towns to be shared. In this case the resource was a professional dance artist who travelled weekly across five small towns Ravensthorpe, Hopetoun, Lake King, Munglinup and Jerramungup engaging over 300 individuals in contemporary dance.

After four 8-week terms of testing, it has proven to be a usable program model that ultimately, could be used across various artforms.

The Interregional Dance Showcase infused regional connections across multi-townships in multi-artforms including dance, textiles, music and film. Costuming for the dance showcase were made locally using upcycled fabric and original music was composed and produced for the final dance piece which will also feature in a short film of the showcase.

Stay tuned as a mixed media exhibition will further showcase this event and the RRAC Dance project.

The RRAC Dance project is part of the wider Regional Arts Partnership Program, supported by the State Government of Western Australia and Country Arts WA.

■ GRDC PADDOCK PRACTICES

Enhancing the performance of sprayers, improving product application and mitigating spray drift factors are some of the ways in which grain growers can maximise spray efficacy when managing pests, diseases and weeds.

Poor efficacy from pesticide applications not only contribute to a waste of time, money and resources, but can also lead to the onset of resistance among weeds, pests and diseases through sub-lethal dosage.

Weather and climate

One of the first measures in ensuring spray efficacy is to make sure weather conditions are suitable.

The [GRDC's Spray Application Manual](#) details how growers can assess if conditions are suitable for spraying.

This includes:

Using accurate forecast information to help plan spraying activities.

Always measuring and recording weather parameters at the site of the application before, during and on completion of spraying operations.

Assessing wind speed and wind direction. These are critical for determining whether conditions are suitable and any potential risks.

Using temperature and humidity (or Delta T value) to indicate evaporation and spray drift risk, as well as any potential effects on efficacy.

Following the label directions for appropriate conditions for spraying, including downwind buffers or no-spray zones that are related to wind speed.

Considering what weather monitoring equipment will best suit your enterprise.

Other climatic conditions such as frost can also have an effect on spray efficacy.

In 2013 and 2014, the University of Adelaide ran trials to examine the effect of frost on clethodim applied to annual ryegrass under controlled environment conditions using a frost chamber.

Seedlings of annual ryegrass were sprayed at the three-leaf stage with increasing rates of clethodim before and after exposure to three consecutive nights of -2 degrees Celsius (°C) to simulate frost events.

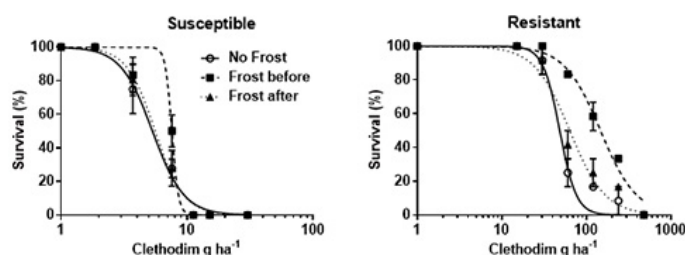


Figure 1: Response of clethodim resistant annual ryegrass populations identified in Victoria and Western Australia to clethodim treatment with three simulated nights of frost prior to or post application. Control plants were not sprayed with herbicide and plant survival was assessed 28 days after completion of frost treatment. Source: Saini et al, 2015.

This research found that simulated frost reduced clethodim

activity on susceptible annual ryegrass populations, particularly events occurring before clethodim application (figure 1).

Sprayer set up

Ensuring the sprayer is set up correctly is another critical step in ensuring product efficacy.

The [GRDC's Spray Height Control fact sheet](#) advises that the spray pattern from each nozzle should fan out so the edge of the spray pattern meets the target area directly under the adjacent nozzle. This is often referred to as achieving a 'double overlap'.

The target area may be weeds, when no stubble or crop is present, or the top of the stubble or crop canopy. If the nozzle height is too low the double overlap will not be achieved, which can result in uneven deposits of spray across the boom. Excessive boom height increases the risk of spray drift.

Increasing water rates can also help improve pesticide efficacy.

Spray volumes are about ensuring there is adequate coverage on the target weeds and effective penetration through the crop canopy for in-crop herbicide applications.

When applying fully translocated herbicides targeted at small to medium sized weeds with low stubble loads (1.5-2 t/ha), spray water volumes normally need to be at least 50 to 60 litres per hectare, increasing to 70 to 80L/ha as stubble loads increase.

For contact herbicides targeting small weeds, often a minimum of 70 to 80L/ha spray volume is required, increasing to 100L/ha for heavier stubble loads.

Reducing ground speed of the sprayer can also help to improve efficacy.

Work conducted by consultant Bill Campbell showed that slowing down from 27km/h to 22km/h when applying fungicide in a late canola canopy in Western Australia improved coverage and penetration into the canopy greatly.

Measuring the percentage of coverage on water sensitive paper is a useful tool for comparing spray set ups.

As a rule of thumb, fungicides required greater than 15 per cent coverage to achieve an acceptable level of efficacy. This can be measured using the [Snapcard App](#).

Nozzle choice

The primary function of a nozzle is to control flow rate and convert the spray liquid into droplets (via atomisation) that are of a suitable size for depositing and retention on the intended target.

Spray quality (the size of the droplets produced) is influenced by nozzle design, operating pressure, the angle of the spray pattern, the properties of the tank mix and, for some nozzles, the inclusion of air into the droplet.

It can be challenging to choose the right nozzle for different spray products, targets and conditions. It is important to

Improving in-season spray efficacy

consider how different types of nozzles work and some of the things that can affect nozzle and spray performance, including deposition and drift potential.

To help growers choose the right nozzle, the GRDC has a [Nozzle Selection Guide](#).

This can be used in conjunction with the [GRDC's Nozzle Selection For Boom, Band And Shielded Spraying: The Back Pocket Guide](#) to help ensure spray efficacy is adequate.

Rotate modes of action

Rotating pesticide modes of action is critical in reducing the risk of resistance occurring and ensuring spray efficacy is adequate.

cesar and the Centre for Crop and Disease Management (CCDM) advise growers to use chemicals with more care to slow the spread of resistance and preserve chemical efficacy, particularly where it is known resistance already exists in some chemical groups.

Rotating and alternating between different modes of action will reduce selection of particular resistance mechanisms.

For fungicides, this could mean:

- Only spraying if necessary
- Choosing mixtures with different modes of action
- Never applying the same fungicide twice in a row
- Incorporating the use of seed dressings, in-furrow and foliar products containing fungicide mixtures from different

chemical groups

- Not exceeding label rates

CCDM also has a [Recipe for Success fact sheet](#) which explains to growers how they can manage fungicide resistance.

This 'recipe' states:

Quick fungal disease identification allows rapid and effective intervention. Spray before the pressure of disease is high.

Always follow the recommendations of the label. Doses above the recommended rate will increase selection for resistance.

If possible, use fungicide mixtures formulated with more than one mode of action.

If you can, alternate fungicides with different modes of action between each fungicide treatment within one season.

Spray water quality

According to the [GRDC's Spray Water Quality fact sheet](#), the quality of the water used for spraying operations can be critical to ensuring the best spray results for many farm chemicals. Many products can be affected by poor water quality.

Water testing should be done on an annual basis when using bore water, water from streams and rivers, reticulated (piped) water sourced from ground water, and water stored in unlined dams or concrete tanks.

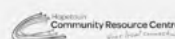

National On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme

The Australian and Western Australian governments are

working together to deliver \$4.6 million in national rebates to livestock farmers and pastoralists in rural Western Australia for on-farm water infrastructure.

The National On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme is available to eligible commercial livestock farmers and pastoralists in rural WA.

The rebate is for 25% up to a maximum of \$25,000 for the purchase of new water infrastructure, delivery and installation to address animal welfare needs and improves resilience to drought.

Eligible items include water storage devices such as tanks and troughs, pipes, fittings and pumps associated with water distribution systems, new bores and the desilting of dams by a contractor.

Rebates can be applied to costs incurred after June 30th, 2018, and applications close April 30th, 2021 or when the funding allocation is exhausted, whichever occurs first.

Eligible items include water storage devices such as tanks and troughs, pipes, fittings and pumps associated with water distribution systems, the drilling of new stock water bores and the desilting of dams by a contractor. 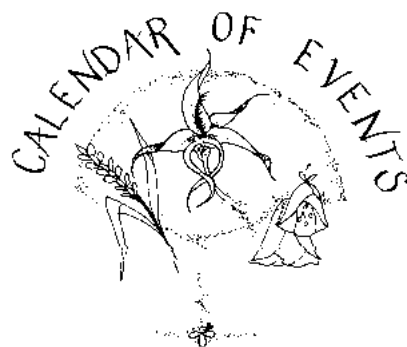
