A very humble thank you to the beautiful people of Ravensthorpe.

This fundraiser is most unexpected and was very overwhelming from the first knowledge of this happening for myself, Bec, Louisa and Craig.

It came with an immediate wave of emotion, being touched by the care, love and generosity from everyone in this community—Thank you!

I'm so sorry for the shock of the news of my accident to everyone. This was an accident that was most unexpected and a dumb moment I had, getting one step ahead of myself.

However I am proud of myself and help from above, for being able to fight for myself and my little family to survive the accident.

An amputation of my left hand and of two fingers on my right hand is a small sacrifice to be with the ones I love.

I have experienced the whole medical system—from getting myself to the

hospital in Ravy, Volunteer St John's ambos to the airstrip, RFDS jet flight to Jandakot, transfer to Fiona Stanley ED, immediate operations by skilled surgeons and the care from nursing staff on the ward.

Then the transfer to the State Rehabilitation Service and placed in their care to give me every opportunity for full recovery.

I'm so fortunate and proud of the country we live in.

To my twin brother Luke and Colin Thomas, sorry

for slacking off on the job! I appreciate their efforts, continuing on and finishing the cropping program. I'm so proud of you both. I'll say this quickly and quietly—I love you both, Thank you.

I also acknowledge all the boys from the Ravy Fire Brigade and DFES for their continued support. Visits from Max Osborne and the Wellness Officers to help with my recovery.

To my beautiful wife Bec—you have been the solid rock for our family, I love you.

Also family and close friends for their visits in hospital and rehab and your continued love and support.

I've got through operations successfully and healing very well. Now going through the process of physio, OT work and future prosthetics.

Life will get back to nearly normal with challenges ahead. But I feel confident that all things will be possible, with the support and love around myself and Bec.

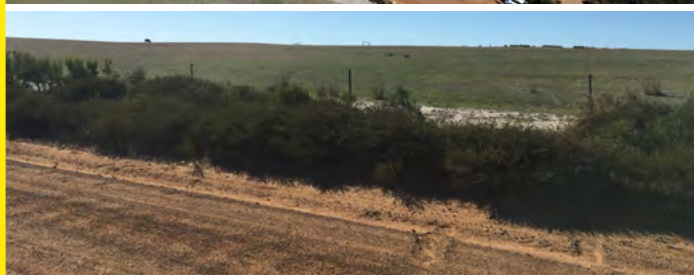

A friend once said to me, "When people live in a beautiful and inspiring environment, they will naturally be creative."

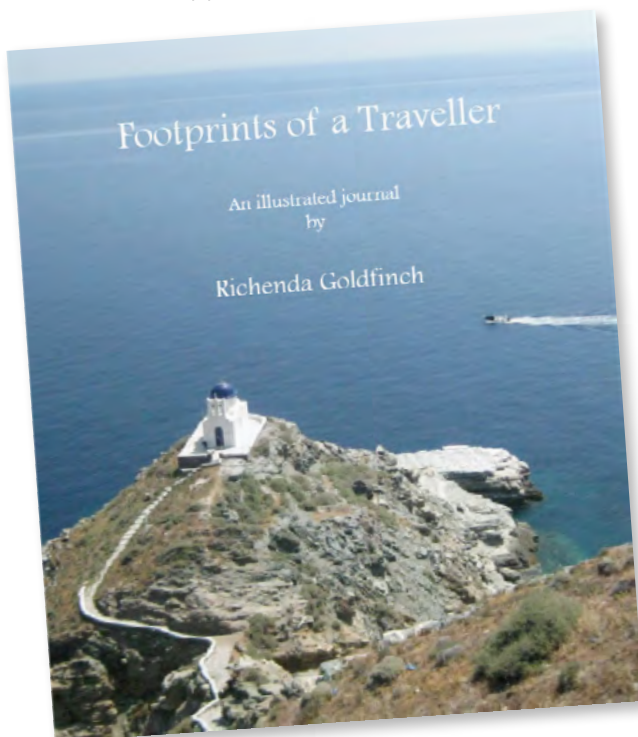
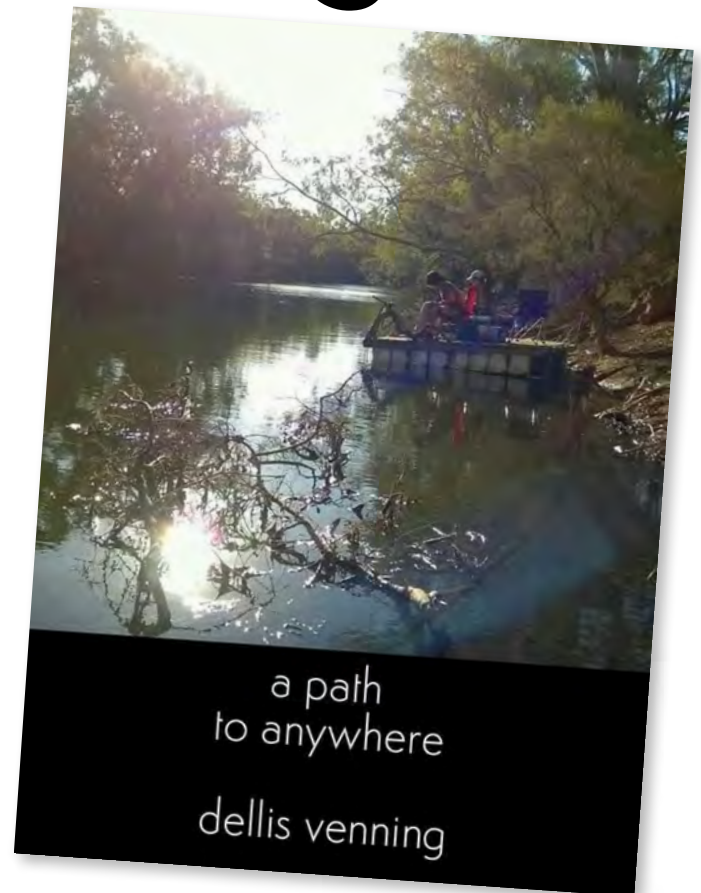

Did You Know?

The facts about the history of the word dearth are quite simple: the word derives from the Middle English form derthe, which has the same meaning as our modern term. That Middle English form is assumed to have developed from an Old English form that was probably spelled dieth and was related to dēore, the Old English form that gave us the word dear. (Dear also once meant “scarce,” but that sense of the word is now obsolete.) Dearth, in one form or another, has been used to describe things that are in short supply since at least the 13th century, when it often referred to a shortage of food.

South Coast Management Group to fold after over 20 years of operation

South Coast Management Group announced it is ceasing to operate this week, after successfully undertaking Coastcare work along the South Coast of Western Australia for over 20 years.

The not-for-profit community group formed in 1997 to help communities work in partnership with local governments from Esperance to Denmark.

The group historically attracted considerable funding, receiving over \$2 million for coastal management work since formation.

Peter Caron, chair of South Coast Management Group, said the multiple factors influenced the decision to fold.

Local governments have become much more active in coastal management over recent years, and vastly reduced funding opportunities had made operating very difficult.

He stated the future of coastal environments in our region remained looking positive, and that long-term partner

Court Result:

On June 28th in the Perth District Court, Claude Shaine BENNELL of Hopetoun was convicted of 'Aggravated Home Burglary,' 'Aggravated Assault Occasioning Bodily Harm,' and 'Criminal Damage' x 2. He was sentenced to 14, 12, 3, and 2 months imprisonment, with some of the sentences served concurrently.

The crimes were committed against his then elderly neighbours at their home in Hopetoun on November 12th, 2017.

Through the bravery and assistance afforded by the victims to the police and the justice system, the matter was followed through until the end.

As a successful recipient of funding through the REDs Grants (Round One), the NPY Women's Council has recently established the first of two satellite offices in the Ngaanyatjarra Lands, to expand the work of the Tjanpi Desert Weavers and encourage increased participation in the arts economy.

The Tjanpi Desert Weavers welcomes Sally Foster to the team as an Arts and Culture Assistant operating from the new Wingellina office. Sally has recently completed two weeks of training in Alice Springs and has hit the ground running, working with the Tjanpi artists in the Wingellina area. This new role will help the artists involved in the program to increase the value and volume of works produced, promoting greater economic participation and benefit to local communities.

Child Car Restraints

Get yours checked

In Western Australia, the leading cause of death for children aged zero to 14 years is transport related injury. Motor vehicle accidents are one of the most common causes of transport related injury for children.

Whenever children are passengers in a vehicle they should be seated in the most appropriate child car restraint for their age and size. A correctly fitted and used child car restraint can significantly reduce the risk of serious injury or death in road crashes.

The current WA road rules state that all children, at least to the age of 7 years, must be restrained in a suitable and correctly fitted car restraint at all times. Drivers are legally responsible for ensuring that children are suitably restrained in a vehicle.

If a child is not wearing a seat belt or a suitable child restraint as required by the law, then the driver risks being fined and incurring demerit points.

When choosing a child car restraint you need to ensure the restraint suits your child, car and individual needs.

There are a number of things you need to check and consider before purchasing a second hand car restraint such as Australian standards labelling, date



of manufacture, wear and stress.

There is a network of trained Child Car Restraint Fitters throughout WA, including one right here in Hopetoun, to provide advice and assistance with the installation of child car restraints, as well as providing information regarding the suitability of restraints according to the child's weight and size.

Changes to Pensioner travel scheme

Pensioners in your community will be affected by changes to the management of the WA Pensioner Free Travel Scheme.

What will change?

The paper WA Free Travel vouchers issued with Pensioner Concession Card renewals will cease from the end of December 2019.

Free Travel entitlements on Transwa services will remain and from January 2020 will be managed electronically by Transwa and issued for travel within each eligible calendar year.

Before booking with Transwa each WA pensioner must be registered so their concession and entitlement details can be verified and their electronic entitlement established.

Pensioners living above the 26th parallel will still apply to the Department of Transport for access to eligible air or private coach transport (transport.wa.gov.au/aboutus/pensioner-free-trip-scheme.asp)

How do Pensioners Register for Free Travel?

Pensioners can complete and return the Pensioner Free Travel Registration Form to Transwa at our Reply Paid address.

Registration forms will be sent with Pensioner

Concession Card renewals and to known Transwa customers or can be downloaded from the Transwa website.

Alternatively, pensioners can

register online at transwa.wa.gov.au-Pensioner-Free-Travel.

Pensioners are encouraged to register as soon as possible to ensure their 2020

free travel entitlement is allocated when they become available for booking in October 2019.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS:

I have a Pensioner Concession Card from Department of Human Services (DHS) / Department of Veteran Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take one free return or two free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

I have a Gold Health Card from Department of Veteran Affairs (DVA). What am I entitled to?

Once registered and your concession has been validated, you may take two free return or four free single trips on Transwa services each calendar year (from 2020).

How do I register for Pensioner Free Travel and get my concession validated?

Complete the online registration form and attach images of both sides of your concession card(s).

Alternatively download and print the registration form (PDF), complete and send to Transwa with photocopies of both sides of your card.

What do I do if I have a digital wallet instead of a concession card?

A digital wallet allows you to have your concession or health card with you everywhere you take your smart device. Transwa accept either the physical card or your digital wallet as evidence of your valid concession. When registering we ask for a photocopy or scan of your card. You can also screenshot your digital wallet and send us the image with your online registration form.

Why do I need to give Transwa consent to access my concession records held by Centrelink?

We need your consent to enable the Australian Government Department of Human Services (Centrelink) to confirm the concession details you provide to the Public Transport Authority of WA (Transwa) when you register with us. The consent you give remains valid with Transwa unless you withdraw your consent by contacting us.

How do I book my pensioner free travel?

There are a number of ways to book your Pensioner Free Travel with Transwa once you have registered. Have your concession card/digital wallet handy and:

Call us on 1300 662 205

Visit us at one of our Transwa Booking Centres or visit one of our accredited agents. Book online (available from late 2019)

What do I do if my travel plans change?

We know plans often change. To cancel or re-schedule your trip, call us on 1300 662 205 prior to the scheduled departure of the first leg of your journey and we will re-book or arrange for your Pensioner Free Travel entitlement to be reinstated.

Can I still use my WA Free Trip Vouchers from Centrelink or DVA if I have not registered with Transwa?

From 2020 you must be registered with Transwa to receive Pensioner Free Travel on Transwa services. Transwa will calculate your travel entitlement each calendar year and you will not need to provide a paper voucher.

Can I still receive a concession fare after I have used my free travel entitlements?

In addition to Pensioner Free Travel, WA Pensioner Concession cardholders and WA Gold Health cardholders can claim a 50% concession on all Transwa services.

Do I need travel insurance?

Travel involves many risks and our liability to you may be limited in certain circumstances. We strongly suggest that you protect yourself by purchasing comprehensive travel insurance cover for (without limitation) loss of booking due to delays or cancellations, damage or loss to personal baggage and other items, personal liability, death, personal injury and medical costs. 





Around the RCSN Port Zones

ALBANY PORT ZONE

The management of snails remains a high priority issue for many growers in the Albany port zone.

Local growers may be interested to know about a new GRDC investment project, to be conducted by Stirlings to Coast Farmers (SCF), that aims to determine whether snail rollers can cost-effectively remove small conical snails from canola and barley.

The project will involve controlled and replicated testing of a snail roller and rotary grain cleaner to clean the species from contaminated canola and barley.

It aims to equip growers and advisers with best practice guidelines to enable informed decisions to be made regarding the economics of grain cleaning.

It outlines how a consistent approach to integrated pest management throughout the year should help to reduce numbers and damage to manageable levels and prevent them from becoming a more significant problem.

Baiting remains a key tool for all growers, but it is important to use other mitigation strategies, in addition to baiting, to provide adequate snail control in the long term.

Meanwhile, resources are available that can help growers to manage these pests, including the GRDC publication [‘Mitigating snails, slugs and slaters in southern Western Australia’](#), written and compiled by SCF.

The growers interviewed for the booklet found that with no control and the right environmental conditions, snail numbers could build up quickly, so consistency and timing are important.

ESPERANCE PORT ZONE

Growers may already be aware that, for the first time, evidence has been found of green peach aphid (GPA) evolving resistance to sulfoxaflor, the active ingredient in Transform™.

The low-level resistance to sulfoxaflor was detected in a small number of GPA populations collected near Esperance.

GPA is a widespread pest of canola and pulse crops and is a key vector of turnip yellows virus (TuV) (formerly known as beet western yellows virus).

Sulfoxaflor, a group 4C insecticide, is an important tool in GPA management in canola, particularly since effective chemistries are limited. In Australia, GPA is already known to have resistance to synthetic pyrethroids, carbamates, organophosphates and neonicotinoids.

Growers attending GRDC Open Forums in the Esperance port zone on July 30 will have the opportunity to speak with GRDC pests manager Leigh Nelson who will be available to discuss current and future GRDC investments into GPA.

The Open Forums will be held at Ravensthorpe Recreation Centre (8-11am) and Grass Patch hall (4-7pm).

Study tours now assessed on continuous basis

GRDC

GRDC Grower and Adviser Study Tours, which were previously offered through two rounds each year, are now offered and assessed on a continuous basis.

The GRDC invests up to 50 per cent of the cost of these tours that favour groups pursuing a clear learning objective that will lead to practice change on farm.

Applications need to demonstrate how proposed tours are aligned with the GRDC's purpose of investing in research, development and extension (RD&E) to create enduring profitability for Australian grain growers and how it fits within [GRDC's RD&E Plan 2018-2023](#).

Growers should comprise at least 75pc of any proposed study tour group.

Ensuring outcomes of study tours are communicated effectively to the industry is an important component of these investments.

Support may occasionally be considered for individuals who hold leadership positions in the Australian grains industry, and where the activity supports outcomes proposed in the GRDC's Capacity and Ability Framework (for guidance see [page 22 of GRDC's RD&E Plan 2018-2023](#)) and the benefit of GRDC support flows to the industry as a whole.

In the kitchen...

Winter Warmers

Minestrone Soup

Serves 6

20 mins preparation

30 mins cooking

Ingredients:

1 tbs Woolworths Select Spanish classic olive oil
1 onion, finely chopped
1 stick celery, finely chopped
1 leek, halved lengthways and thinly sliced
1 garlic clove, thinly sliced
1 carrot, peeled & cut into 1cm dice
1 Golden Delight potato, peeled & cut into 1cm dice
1 tbs Woolworths Select tomato paste
400g can Woolworths Select Australian diced tomatoes

1. Heat oil in a large sauté pan or casserole pan over medium heat. Add onion, celery and leek. Cook, stirring for 5 minutes or until leek is soft. Add garlic, carrot and potato, cook, stirring, for 4 minutes.



2. Add tomato paste, cook, stirring, for 1 minute. Add tomatoes, stock and ½ cup of water. Bring to the boil. Boil gently for 10 minutes. Add pasta, simmer for 10 minutes, or until pasta and vegetables are almost tender.

3. Add cannellini beans, kale and green beans, cook stirring for 2 minutes or until beans are cooked and bright green. Season to taste and scatter with parsley. Serve with parmesan and crusty bread.

Tips:

1. you can add a tablespoon of pesto at the end for extra flavour
2. This soup is a great way to use seasonal vegetables, swap out carrot, potato and kale for other root vegetables and leafy greens.
3. You can freeze this soup in airtight containers for up to 2 months to take to work.

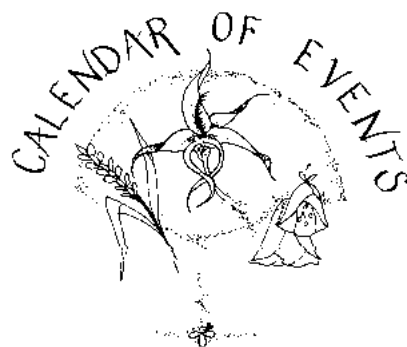
