### Did You Know?

When it comes to international diplomacy, the French may not always have the last word—but they have quite a few, many of which they've shared with English. We began using *démarche*—which in French can mean "gait," "walk," or "action," among other things—in the 17th century. It was first used generally in the sense of "a maneuver," and before long it developed a specific use in the world of diplomacy. Some of the other diplomacy-related words we use that come from French include *attaché*, *chargé d'affaires*, *communiqué*, *détente*, and *agrément*—not to mention the words *diplomacy* and *diplomat* themselves.

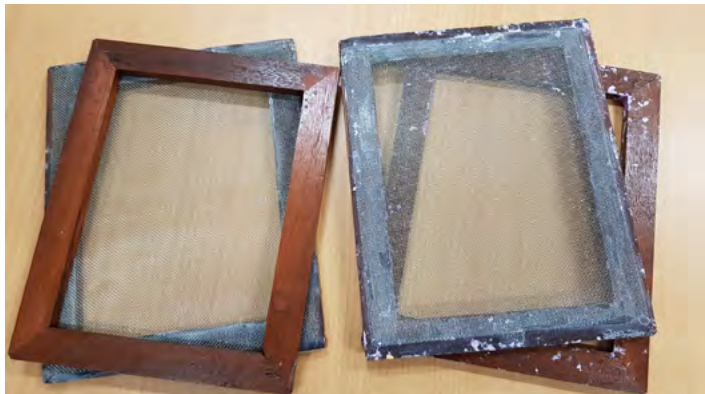
The group experimented with different colours and techniques as well as discussing the more traditional methods of papermaking.

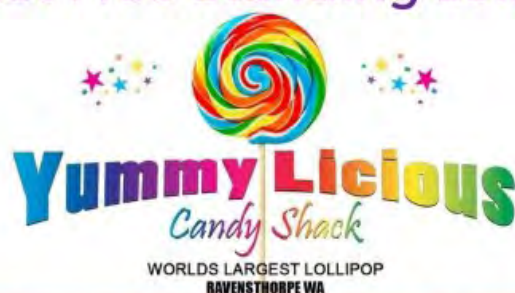

Roald delivered the session last week which covered topics relating to providing food services, temporary food stalls, kitchen inspections, permits and fees. Subjects such as markets, cake stalls, sausage sizzles and fundraisers were a popular topic of conversation.

The Food Act 2008 governs the requirements for these services and although there has been no recent changes to the Act, there has been some expansion within the Shire of Ravensthorpe enforcing these regulations which has perhaps been perceived as a change of rules by many community groups and members.

# Jerdacuttup Kids in the Kwongan

## ■ HOPETOUN CRC

Leading up to the annual Ravensthorpe Wildflower Show, students from Jerdacuttup have been immersed in their local environment seeking inspiration for their art.

The consequence of these rich learning experiences has led to the production of a series of prints and painting on calico panels that are perfectly suited for display at the September Wildflower Gala Luncheon at our very own Jerdacuttup Hall.

With excursions into the bush with Malleefowl Recovery Officer, Liz Kington to monitor mound activity, forays out of bounds around school grounds to hunt for flowers and bees in Kwongan country and a visit from an expert artist, staff and students have been well equipped to create masterpieces of technology and creativity.

Apps on phones helped in the monitoring of the gnow mounds. Scanning, emailing and then commercial cutting of students' bee drawings produced high quality stencils for screen printing and advanced paint products applied and heat fixed to make the art work.

With the expert help of visiting artist Tricia Stedman (and funding from the Western Cell Network of schools) students from kindergarten to year five learnt how to set up silk screens for their bee stencils and use top techniques for applying the fabric paints.

Follow-up screen printing to build a swarm of bees on each piece was followed by careful examination of local wildflowers (referencing the South Coast NRM Wildflower Faces Colour and Learn book illustrated by Jane Thompson and our Kwongan bush).

The drawing and painting of the flowers using different fabric paints to the screen printing paints has led to images of beautiful flowers (many yet to be formally identified and named).

We hope many are able to admire and appreciate our artwork at the Wildflower Gala Luncheon!

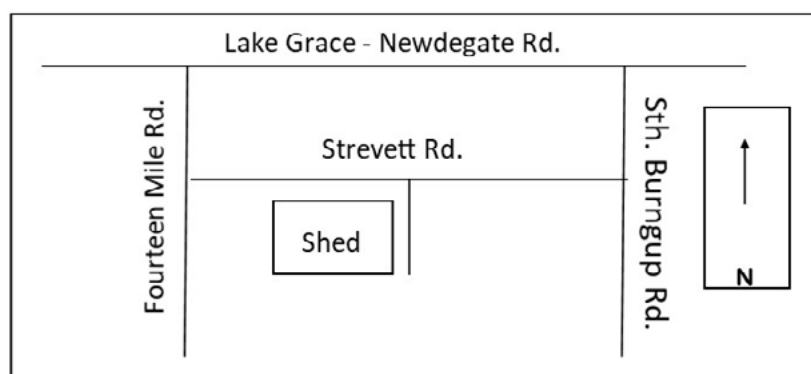

### ROAD CONSTRUCTION:

The Shire Works Crew will be at Lake Magenta Road this

month as they complete the gravel sheeting.

Please look out for our road works team and reduce your speed in these areas. Help keep the roads safer for everyone.

As a result of the dry conditions, the crew have been undertaking maintenance works including, gravel sheeting clay sections on bus routes to improve the skid resistance, patching pavement failures and cul-vert upgrades.

As weather conditions improve, the crew will recommence improvement works on Meechi Road at the Devil Creek crossing. These works consist of cutting 2 metres off the hill to the south of the creek crossing and 1.5 metre fill over the culvert. This cut to fill works will significantly improve the vertical alignment of the road and combined with the curve realignment to the north of the crossing, will dramatically improve traffic safety for motorists at this location.

### ROAD MAINTENANCE:

The dry conditions have not been favourable for maintenance grading so the crew are still focussing on maintaining not only the running surface, but also offshoot drains, back-slopes, the inside of curves and sight lines at intersections to improve driving conditions for the road user.

Some gravel patching has been undertaken to rectify failures in the road pavement and all road users are urged to drive accordingly given the ever changing conditions.

### TOWN SERVICES:

The recent rains have helped rejuvenate the lawns and established native gardens within both town sites that were struggling as a result of the dry spell. Unfortunately, with the rain comes the onset of weeds so the annual spray program has commenced on the most affected roads.

The Great Southern Technical and Further Education (TAFE) campus have now propagated in excess of 12,000 native plants from seeds collected within work areas and these will be planted at rehabilitation sites by Cert III and IV students as part of their Cert III CLM training. TAFE may even exceed having 20,000 native seedlings propagated by the time the rehabilitation works commence later this year. This type of exposure to real time works has been invaluable training to these students undertaking their Cert III and Cert IV CLM units.

I am pleased to welcome Jamie Turner to our Town Services team who started on the 4 June. Jamie will be working predominantly with town services and with the road maintenance crew as required. Jamie has completed his Certificate III and IV in Conservation and Land Management and will be working towards completing his Diploma in Conservation and Land Management.

# Farming News

## Background: Agricultural Produce Commission

Recently, WAFarmers which represents over 1150 farm businesses and 4500 individual members across Western Australia, considered the current structure of the Agricultural Produce Commission Act 1988 and noted that it currently excludes broadacre production from accessing this legal framework to collect grower funds to provide for the development and security of growers.

The APC Act, provides a Fee For Service collected by producers for producers under a fair framework. Broadacre farmers are currently excluded to take advantage of what has been available and successfully used to benefit industry by the horticultural, wine, pork and poultry sectors.

WAFarmers strongly believes that there should be an opportunity available without exception to all primary producers in Western Australia, to access the Act should they wish to.

Earlier this year, WAFarmers requested Minister Alannah MacTiernan to review and remove the exclusion of Broadacre from the APC Act 1988, as the Act was up for review.

- After consulting widely with our commodity councils, members and non-members across the state, WAFarmers requested:
- The removal of the exclusion of broadacre cropping and grazing from the APC Act
  - To include an Opt-Out Clause

If parliament pass these amendments, and the exclusion of broadacre is removed, it does not mean an APC committee is automatically implemented. Farmers will still need to vote to move the APC to the next stage, should industry wish to set up producer committees. If farmers choose to vote favourably on the APC, those who are opposed can opt-out and opt-back in when they feel value.

The APC is not a tax or levy implemented by the government. It is a legislative instrument that may be accessed by producers to raise funds of their own accord when issues or market failure presents. Currently, broadacre farmers do not have the choice or option to access this tool, unlike similar industries.

WAFarmers supports free choice for growers, economic growth and on-farm returns. WAFarmers does not support the introduction of more levies or taxes on Western Australian producers. What we do support is industry having the option to self-resource funding options should they wish. Currently the broadacre producers of Western Australia do not have this option.

Furthermore, for clarity the financial status of WAFarmers is stable and very much sustainable. Please contact head office should members be concerned.

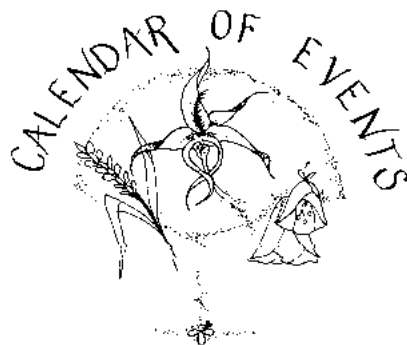
