



Definition:

1 : to do something extemporaneously : improvise; especially : to compose, perform, or speak extemporaneously
2 : to get along in a makeshift manner

Did You Know?

Extemporize means to say or do something on the spur of the moment, an appropriate meaning given the word's history. Extemporize was coined by adding the suffix -ize to Latin ex tempore, meaning "instantaneously" or "on the spur of the moment." Ex tempore, in turn, was formed by combining ex and the noun tempus, meaning "time." Incidentally, ex tempore was also borrowed wholesale into English (where it means "extemporaneously"). Other descendants of Latin ex tempore include the now rare extemporal and extemporary (both synonyms of extemporaneous), and as you have no doubt guessed by now, extemporaneous itself.

A SHARPER MIND

Tai chi can improve cognitive function

We at Ravensthorpe Tai Chi wish to share an article (2019) that can be found on the following web site: www.health.harvard.edu/mind-and-mood-taichi

It briefly outlines the results of many studies.

"In a meta-analysis of 20 studies on tai chi and cognition, tai chi appears to improve executive function—the ability to multitask, manage time and make decisions—in people without any cognitive decline. In those with mild cognitive impairment, tai chi slowed the progression of dementia more than any other types of exercise."

Another study compared people being put in a walking group, social interaction group and a tai chi group. This lasted 40 weeks. The aim was to measure brain volume. At the end of this period MRI images were taken of the 3 groups. Those in the tai chi group showed a higher level of brain volume increase.

Ravensthorpe Tai Chi operates in the Senior Citizens Hall each Wednesday and 9.30 am and lasts for an hour. The cost is \$2. We have coffee afterwards.

Is your Will up to date?

The Public Trustee (Department of Justice) is heading to the Shire of Esperance and the Shire of Ravensthorpe to host free information seminars that will help individuals to make informed choices about making and storing their Wills, and planning for the future administration of their financial affairs and estates.

Presented by Etta Palumbo, WA's best known public speaker on Wills and Director at the Public Trustee, the talks will educate people on the need to make legally valid Wills and will provide advice and understanding surrounding the deceased estate administration process, as well as other helpful information such as having an Enduring Power of Attorney and Enduring Power of Guardianship in place, safeguarding against Financial Elder Abuse in later life and more.

While most people know they need to write a Will, according to research conducted by the Public Trustee, 49% of West Australians have never made a Will and a further 34% of the local population acknowledge that their will is not up-to-date. Without a Legal Will there is potential for the law to step in and decide where your assets go, possibly favouring relatives you resent.

Triggers for writing Wills generally come from major life changes such as the birth of a baby, marriage, death of a family member, a medical crisis or buying a home. However, according to Public Trustee Director, Etta Palumbo, there is no better time than now to start planning for the future.

"Create a Will now while there is no pressure and give yourself peace of mind in knowing that your wishes will be followed. If someone passes away without a legal will, assets may be distributed against your wishes or could even revert to state government control if no close relatives are found", says Ms Palumbo.

Seeking Expressions of Interest for fencing to protect EPBC habitat

RAIN is seeking expressions of interest for a project to help improve status of the threatened species, malleefowl and chuditch (Western quoll).

Works for this project include erecting 3 km of fencing to control animal access into 30 hectares of malleefowl or chuditch habitat.

Please note that:

- The site should be near or adjacent reserves and include remnant vegetation, ecological corridors or known nesting sites.
- Fence line cannot be erected along property boundaries.
- A contractor can be hired or you can complete the work yourself.
- A site inspection is required for groundtruthing and approval before work can commence.
- Photo monitoring points will need to be set up on site for before and after comparison.
- Project costs will be covered by RAIN up to an amount of \$2400/km totalling \$7200.
- Payment will be made as a reimbursement after the project is complete.
- Works must be completed by June 2020.
- Funding for this activity will be available yearly from 2019-2023 (quantities will differ).

Net blotches - something to look out for

Have you seen any spot form or net form net blotch on your barley crop lately?

The Centre for Crop and Disease Management (CCDM) is calling on growers from RAIN to join in on the Barley Disease Cohort Project - a project that aims to work directly with growers from WA's Southern grain-growing region to get to the bottom of fungicide resistance in barley.

Why net blotches? Because these diseases were recently identified as fungicide resistant to three active ingredients within Group 3 DMI fungicides, with resistant pathogens found in both the Esperance and Albany Port Zones.

Within this project CCDM hopes to share experiences and knowledge with the cohort, finding out exactly where resistance is occurring and carrying out field trials to develop solutions to managing the growing problem.

The project not only involves the benchmarking of fungicide resistance of barley net blotches in the cohort's region, but also analysis of the decision-making behind managing fungicide resistance, hoping to see positive changes on how decisions are made from new data available.

Cohort members will work with CCDM by:

- Sending in diseased barley leaves for fungicide resistance research.
- Answering survey questions on management decisions.
- Being part of a cycle of co-innovation with CCDM researchers in helping to find solutions to managing fungicide resistance.

Consumer Protection is aware that contamination or damage to homes from illegal drug activity is a worry for tenants, owners and property industry professionals.

But how do you identify past production, or smoking, of meth, heroin or cannabis at a property and whether there are potential health risks as a result?

We've been working with WA's Department of Health (DOH) on a guide about this issue, focusing on clandestine laboratories (clan labs), smoke houses and cannabis grow houses. See: www.commerce.wa.gov.au/consumer-protection/illegal-drug-activity-homes

Clan lab contamination is the subject of much public debate – symptoms of exposure range from behavioural changes, sleep disturbance and respiratory problems. At former cannabis grow houses we know that a physical risk could exist due to electrical safety but harmful, chemical residue is unlikely.

DOH say police tell them when drug properties are disrupted and any public health risk information is forwarded to the local government authority with advice to manage possible property contamination.

Bottom line: unless a property has been used to manufacture drugs the common view is that a thorough clean is often all that is required. There's no need for routine testing between occupancies but if you have

evidence testing is warranted, only use DOH-accredited forensic companies, listed at www.healthywa.wa.gov.au

Home sellers, real estate agents and private landlords will naturally have legal obligations to ensure a property is safe and clean for future occupants (buyers or tenants), so owners may wish to consider precautionary cleaning or testing if there is any clear evidence or signs of significant drug activity.

Real estate agents should use due care and skill to ascertain facts about a home. Clear evidence should be disclosed to a buyer or tenant as would be required under the industry code of conduct.

Owners who know of previous serious drug use and manufacturing at a home should tell prospective tenants, or their real estate agent if they're going to sell the property. Non-disclosure could result in legal action, especially if it can be shown that the information was knowingly withheld.

Anyone who plans to buy or rent a property, and is aware that it is a former drug house, should sight clean-up documentation. Tenants with clear evidence of drug contamination may have options to end their lease if the situation isn't rectified. Email consumer@dmirs.wa.gov.au or call 1300 30 40 54.

We strongly urge everyone to understand the issue before making any snap judgements about the safety or otherwise of a property. If you feel you've been pressured into buying expensive specialist drug testing and decontamination

National On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme

The Australian and Western Australian governments are working together to deliver \$4.6 million in national rebates to livestock farmers and pastoralists in rural Western Australia for on-farm water infrastructure.

The National On-Farm Emergency Water Infrastructure Rebate Scheme is available to eligible commercial livestock farmers and pastoralists in rural WA. The rebate is for 25% up to a maximum of \$25 000 for the purchase of new water infrastructure, delivery and installation to address animal welfare needs and improves resilience to drought.

Eligible items include water storage devices such as tanks and troughs, pipes, fittings and pumps associated with water distribution systems, new bores and the desilting of dams by a contractor.

Rebates can be applied to costs incurred after 30 June 2018, and applications close 30 April 2021 or when the funding allocation is exhausted, whichever occurs first.

Eligible items include water storage devices such as tanks and troughs, pipes, fittings and pumps associated with water distribution systems, the drilling of new stock water bores and the desilting of dams by a contractor. Farming News

Curfew to move agricultural vehicles during Christmas and Easter has not changed

WAFarmers notes the political debate in State Parliament last week on the Christmas and Easter period restrictions for agricultural vehicle movements.

Many farmers were not aware that these regulations have been in place for at least 15 years, and the curfew policy has not changed.

The fact is, most farmers that have been moving machines during these periods have been in contravention of the rules.

In general, farmers have been operating outside of the road rules, as many rules have been unworkable and have not kept up with the increasing size of machinery and the growing size of cropping programs, with farmers cropping over multiple blocks kilometres apart, through farm property aggregation.

The difficulty of obtaining Licenced Pilots at peak times has also been a struggle for many farmers.

WAFarmers recognises that governments will not compromise on road safety during peak holiday periods but will work with peak bodies on practical solutions.

WAFarmers has taken the lead in working constructively with Main Roads through the WAFarmers Transport Committee over the last two years and has ended up achieving a very workable outcome through the new Agricultural Pilot

Requirements.

Government will always have to be cautious of increasing risk due to the growing number of road users, and they will take a precautionary approach; just as farmers operate under the precautionary principle of minimising risk.

WAFarmers CEO Trevor Whittington said the new requirements are a workable solution and we encourage farmers to ensure they are across the rules. There are penalties for non-compliance.

"The revised requirements will enable farmers to be able to move their agricultural machines under less restriction, while still meeting safety requirements on road.

"Although the new requirements will not provide less restriction to all farmers, with many still requiring a Heavy Vehicle Pilot Licence, the revised requirements enable farmers to move larger machinery, for longer distances.

"The risk-based approach Main Roads have used to divide access into zones based on road usage and risk exposure is an improved approach."

WAFarmers welcomes the constructive engagement on these reforms and will continue to work with government on future reforms to ensure farmers can continue to access the state roads when required.
