








The little darlings were followed by community groups from the Hopetoun Ukelele Group (HUG) to the senior's Tai Chi group, along with Enduro Club

If you use detritus in speech, remember to stress the second syllable, as you do in the words arthritis and bronchitis. Once you've mastered its meaning and pronunciation, you'll find that detritus is a term—originally a geology term—that can be applied in many situations. After the first hard freeze of fall, gardens are littered with the detritus of the summer's plants and produce: stalks, leaves, vines, and maybe even an abandoned hand trowel. As a flood-swollen river retreats to its banks, it leaves detritus—debris gathered by the raging waters—in its wake. The detritus of civilization may include junkyards and abandoned buildings; mental detritus may include all kinds of useless trivia. sense, it is possible to sequester property in certain legal situations.

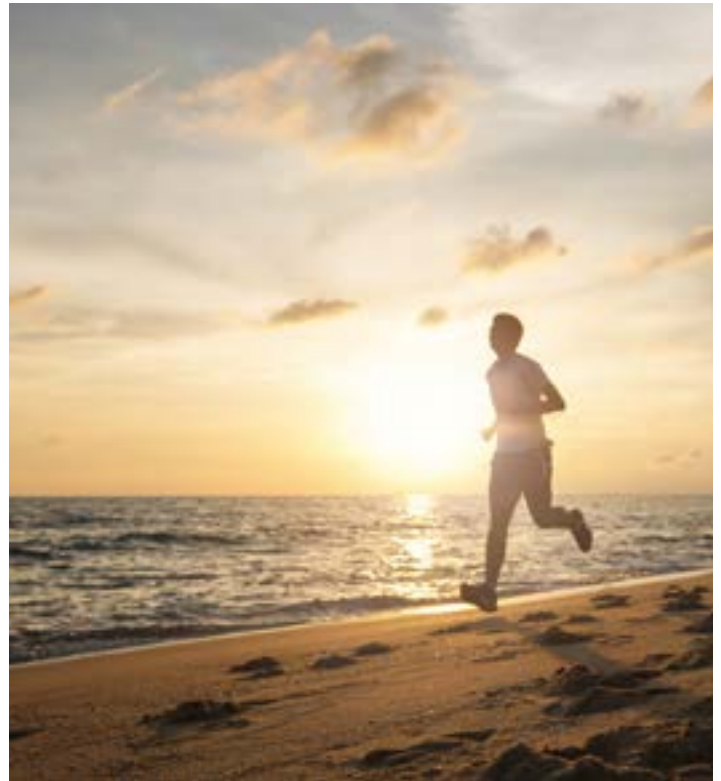

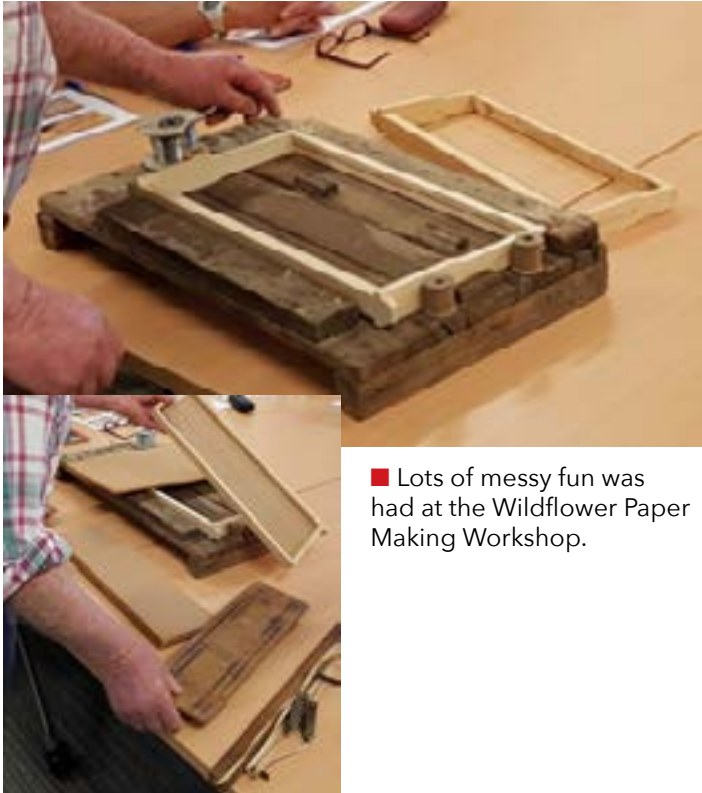
of knowledge and his time with the group was greatly appreciated.

FULL RESTRICTED BURNING TO COMMENCE!

As of Thursday, September 19th 2019; ALL Residents and Property Owners within the Shire were required to obtain a Fire Permit for any Burning Off and/or Hazard Reduction Burning activities upon their land.

A reminder to ALL Permit Holders, a fire permit is a privilege and as such it is your responsibility to;

- Read and adhere to all conditions prescribed on both sides of the permit,
- Check weather conditions are suitable to your burning objectives,
- Ensure the appropriate breaks are installed and adequate fire fighting water is available.

019/20 FIRE BREAK NOTICE PAMPHLET:

The Shire of Ravensthorpe 2019/20 Fire Break Notice pamphlet is now available.

If you have not received your copy of the Fire Break Notice, copies are available from either the Hopetoun or Ravensthorpe Shire Offices, Shire Website or please contact the Shire Office for a copy to be posted.

Please remember your property needs to be compliant to the Fire Control Information notice before Monday, October 14th 2019.

2019/20 BUSHFIRE SEASON OUTLOOK:

The climate outlook for spring is mainly influenced by the Indian Ocean, together with other factors including long-term trends. A positive Indian Ocean Dipole during spring typically increases the chance of below average rainfall for southern and central Australia and has been linked to elevated summer fire danger.

Conditions for Western Australia: Rainfall deficiencies have persisted across most of the south west of Western Australia, with this area experiencing its driest start to the year, followed by the seventh-driest autumn on record. In addition, drier and warmer than average conditions are forecast through to October, which will increase soil moisture deficits and stress in woody vegetation. These conditions have resulted in above normal fire potential for parts of the Swan Coastal Plain, Avon Wheatbelt, Jarrah Forest, Warren, Esperance Plains and Mallee regions.

MINIMUM WATER CAPACITY IN PADDOCKS:

The Ravensthorpe Bush Fire Advisory Committee (BFAC) resolved to impose minimum water capacity standards within the Shire of Ravensthorpe, permissible under Regulation 38A Bush Fires Regulations 1954.

ALL Primary Producers MUST have a minimum of 400lt fire fighting water available per header harvesting or tractor raking/baling operating within the same paddock.

Failure to comply to these requirements will result in a \$500 infringement or if any person is found guilty in any court of competent jurisdiction, \$5000 Court Fine.

HEADER/PADDOCK FIRES:

Due to the various heights of crops around the district and some that have possibly been affected by recent cold temperatures, the Ravensthorpe Bush Fire Advisory Council are asking Farmers and Contractors to take extra care when harvesting in paddocks with the following, to avoid fires starting in paddocks this year;

- Header combs cutting heights,
- Dust and moisture from frosted crops accumulating,
- A Fire extinguisher in proper working order, and
- Carry out required daily maintenance checks

ABC RADIO BROADCAST TIMES:

ABC local radio is not only the official broadcaster of emergency warnings and alerts, they will be broadcasting Harvest and Vehicle Movement Ban information.

Stay tuned to ABC radio at the following times to hear when Harvest and Vehicle Movement bans are in place:

Frequency: 558AM (Wagin) / 837AM (Esperance)

Times: 10:05am / 12:35pm / 3:05pm, Weekdays and Weekends

PLEASE NOTE: ABC will only broadcast harvest and vehicle movement bans when they commence. To be notified when harvest bans have been withdrawn please contact the Shire Office for your mobile phone to be added to the Shire's SMS system or refer to the Shire's Harvest Ban Hotline 08 9839 0035.

TOTAL FIRE BAN INFRINGEMENTS:

Last year the State Government introduced a \$1000 Total Fire Ban Infringement for any activities that breach Total Fire Ban conditions, that result in a fire on days where a Total Fire Ban has been declared.

\$1000 infringements can be issued by either DFES, WA Police, Parks & Wildlife Services and Local Governments.

What does this mean to farming practices—on the day that a Total Fire Ban has been declared harvesting activities can still continue, until a Harvest & Vehicle Movement Ban has been implemented by the Shire. If a fire starts during this period from a header striking a rock, bearing failure, etc this does not constitute as a breach of the Total Fire Ban conditions.

Farmers can still traverse through paddocks to check the welfare of stock, providing that they are in a vehicle with a fire fighting unit carrying a minimum of 500lt.

VOLUNTEER FIRE FIGHTER PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT:

Volunteer Bush Fire Fighters are asked to check over your Bush Fire Jacket, Trousers, Gloves, Goggles, etc ready for the upcoming fire season.

Bushfire Jackets and Trousers can be laundered at home in a

separate wash utilising a cold water delicate wash cycle with only 2x caps of disinfectant; NO washing detergents, powder or fabric softener.

If you have any tears, holes, etc. please report them to your brigade captain for items to be replaced.

NOW IS THE TIME TO PREPARE!

Landowner/occupiers are reminded NOW is the time to start preparing your property for the upcoming fire season, to avoid the unpleasant bushfire warnings or infringements for non compliance.

Top 5 Actions that can be undertaken right now are:

1. TRIM - overhanging trees and shrubs from around your house and buildings
2. MOW - your lawn and remove all the cut grass. All grasses must not exceed 100mm in height.
3. REMOVE - material that can burn around your home.
4. CLEAR - and remove all the debris and leaves from the gutters surrounding your home.
5. PREPARE - a hose or hoses that can stretch all around the house.

PERMANENT CARAVAN OWNERS:

Owners of permanent Caravan's utilised as holiday destinations or place of permanent residence located at any Caravan Park within the Shire of Ravensthorpe are required to take the following actions;

- Reduce fuel loads around your caravan by removing any accumulating leaf litter, fallen sticks/branches and rubbish on top of caravan's, annex's and within 2m radius of the Caravan.

- Remove any overhanging tree branches to achieve a 3m vertical clearance above the caravan itself.

CAMPING & COOKING FIRES

Pursuant to Section 25(1A) Bush Fires Act 1954, the lighting of fires in the open air in the Shire of Ravensthorpe for the purpose of camping and cooking is prohibited during the Prohibited Burning Time, except in the Starvation and Mason Bay camping areas.

All open fires are to be contained within a cement ring provided at these locations or designated fire areas i.e. barbeque—Penalty: \$250 Infringement.

Avoid pet purchase problems

■ DEPARTMENT FOR CONSUMER AFFAIRS

Buying a pet is not like your average purchase. The product, which might be a puppy, dog, kitten, cat, horse or rabbit is likely to become a loved member of your family and with you for its' whole life.

If you have a problem with the quality or there's a defect, you're unlikely to want to use potential consumer law rights to a replacement, or return the pet for a refund. So, you need to thoroughly research the breed, its parents and the seller before you buy. Also think very carefully about your commitment to provide a suitably-sized home, food and

water, exercise and look after your pet's health, including vet bills.

So far this year Consumer Protection has received 29 complaints from pet purchasers. Most (79%) were about puppies or dogs and the most common issue was misrepresentation – that might be when a dog was advertised as a medium-size breed that does not shed but grows to be very large and malts heavily.

Medical issues are common – a pre-purchase vet check can help avoid this. We also hear about a lack of documentation (be sure to get any papers and vaccination certificates) and scams where a popular breed is offered for a low price and a buyer pays in a non-secure way, such as direct bank transfer, then doesn't receive the pet.

There are too many pre-purchase tips to list, so I'd urge you to head to our website www.consumerprotection.wa.gov.au and check out our recently updated publication 'A guide to consumer rights when buying a pet'. The RSPCA also has a detailed checklist at www.rspcawa.asn.au.

You have rights under the Australian Consumer Law if you buy from a shop, or registered breeder that's a business. But these protections are unlikely to be available for private sales, via Gumtree or Facebook marketplace, or when you adopt from a shelter or rescue centre.

Live Export: Mercado analysis confirms value to WA

WAFarmers welcomes the Mercado analysis, funded by LiveCorp and Meat & Livestock Australia today.

The statistical analysis confirms what many Western Australian producers, regional towns and workers have expressed since interruptions to the sheep trade began last year; that regional Western Australia will suffer considerably if the trade is lost.

WAFarmers Livestock President, David Slade said producers are already feeling the effects of the recent moratorium extension to September 22nd, with the disruptions putting at risk every aspect of Western Australia's sheep supply chain.

"We're all suffering, producers right through to livestock transporters, and fodder manufacturers. Sheep live exports are critical to many in the regions, and in times of drought, provides an outlet for many," Mr Slade said.

"This analysis has only solidified the many aspects that will be affected if the government continues to use regulation to render the industry unviable.

"Our long-term markets have begun to look elsewhere, and this is simply not acceptable. Once a market is lost, exporters will go elsewhere to secure consistent and reliable sources.

"The Western Australian sheep and wool industry is reliant on exports out of Fremantle.

"The trade is vital for sheep producers, to reduce their numbers through the sale of export wethers, which can dramatically reduce stocking densities in times of drought and uncertainty.

"Sheep producers are feeling the effects right now. It's incredibly dry out there, and with the moratorium extended, it's not looking good for many producers," Mr Slade said.

WAFarmers continues to support Western Australia's live sheep trade.

September 11th saw the Men's South East

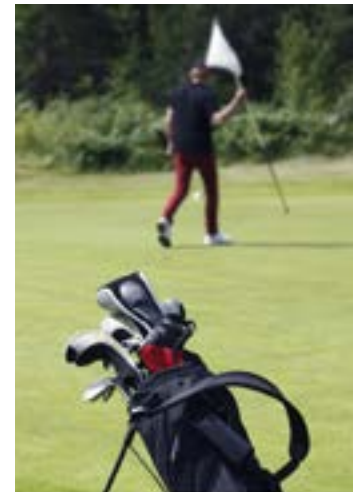
