# Ravensthorpe's Blue Tree Project

Ravensthorpe Progress Association [RPA] invited the community to join them in painting the large tree in the REC car park blue on Sunday December 1st.

The Blue Tree Project began in Western Australia and encourages people to choose a dead tree that needs a 'blue lease on life' and paint it in memory of a friend who lost their life to depression or had battled the illness.

By early afternoon, an enthusiastic contingent of children, young people and adults, probably 50 overall arrived. Some were armed with paint brushes, some thought they would come to observe, but most participated at some stage.

The children started at the base and there was no question - the tree was going to be blue!

This progressed to taller painters, then scaffolding and ladder and eventually the scissors lift - as painting continued up the trunk, of the former Salmon Gum tree, to an estimated height of 30 metres.

R U OK was then painted in white lettering on the upper main trunk and finally solar Christmas lights, were attached by the elevated platform team, and wound down around the new blue tree.

A sausage sizzle was available for a gold coin donation, with all funds to go towards the Mental Health First Aid Training to take place in Ravensthorpe in July 2020.

RPA wishes to thank the Shire of Ravensthorpe for supporting the project and preparing the tree. Also to Pete and Marie-Anne Smith of 4 Rivers Plumbing, Gas & Civil Contracting who have driven the project and part sponsored the paint.

# New vitals monitor for hospital

## ■ Hospital Auxiliary

The new vitals monitor for the resuscitation room at the hospital has arrived and been installed and the staff trained in its use. This has been an ongoing project for the Ravensthorpe Hospital Auxiliary, as the cost was over \$15,000.

The new monitor allows comprehensive patient information at a glance which can make a real difference when multiple patients and priorities demand your attention.

Monitoring also needs to change with patient acuity, and the monitor can provide this with a broad selection of screens tailored to various clinical situations.

Each screen can be customised to present exactly what you want to see, the way you want to see it and allows the nurses to make better clinical decisions on the spot and documents changes in a patient's condition at every stage

The new bedside monitor acts as a multi-measurement module. And once you detach from the host monitor it converts into a transport monitor, with no need to change patient cables before or after transport and allows interchangeable connection with St Johns Ambulance and RFDS equipment.

We are very grateful to all the sponsors for providing our new patient transport monitor and we use the monitor on a daily basis especially in our ER and resuscitation beds.

We wish to thank our major sponsors, Galaxy Lithium Australia Ltd, for their initial contribution and then their top up contribution when our fundraising was still short of the final amount.

Our thanks also to Hopetoun CRC for providing Stokes Inlet pamphlets so that our seniors could read more about this national park before arriving.

Head Ranger Dave Thornburg welcomed the group and provided an interesting insight into key aspects of the National Park. Whilst most of the attractions (e.g. Moir Homestead ruins, Fanny Cove and Shoal Cape) would require 4WD vehicles, nearby trails attracted a number of keen walkers.

We learnt that the estuary, fed by the Young and Lort Rivers, covers 14 square kilometres and is popular with fisherfolk chasing black bream and seasonal King George Whiting. Among over twenty species of water birds, four cormorant species fish the clear estuarine waters while one magnificent pelican cruised by several times during our visit.

By all accounts those who took advantage of the excursion

enjoyed the day, which was made possible by an army of helpers. From the planning and organising, to the set-up and tidy-up, the food preparation and cooking ... some 20 individuals gave freely of their time and energy to ensure the success of the day. To single out any one would not do justice to this wonderful effort - Hopetoun Senior Citizens thank you all.

## Building Better Region Fund

The Shire of Ravensthorpe is taking advantage of the recent announcement by the Federal Government for \$200 million available through the Building Better Region Fund (BBRF) Round 4 for drought affected regions.

The Shire's application will focus on major redevelopment of the Ravensthorpe Town Centre through the Cultural Precinct project to help support and revitalise community and local services as well as help stimulate business and tourism growth for the town and region.

# Dunn Rock Celebrates

## 40 years of farming; 30 years of the Dunn Rock Tennis Club and their inaugural Life Member

Saturday October 5th saw about 60 past, present and future "Dunn Rockers" descended on the Dunn Rock Tennis Club to celebrate the 40th anniversary of the allocation of one of the State's last CP farming allocations.

Also Dunn Rock was celebrating 30 years of the Dunn Rock Tennis Club and to add to the celebrations the tennis club inducted Sally Leo Barnes as their inaugural Life Member, which required a Life Membership board, this uniquely beautiful piece was crafted of planks of wood from many of the local farmers by two talented members, Karren Duncan and Vicki De Landgraft to be added to over the many years to come.

Below is the speech made at this special evening:

Welcome everyone.

Back in the mid 1980's, I think it might have been during our Ladies Luncheons, there had been some discussions about the construction of tennis courts in the Dunn Rock area as our nearest facilities were some 60kms away and as a community we needed a 'meeting point'. Some preliminary considerations had been done but nothing constructive had eventuated.

Then on October 10th 1987 the inaugural meeting of the Dunn Rock Tennis Club was held at Sally Leo's home, called by Sally, informing the meeting of a legacy left to her by her late father Peter Wilkinson who along with Sally's mother Jean were regular visitors from the UK to Dunn Rock, and it was to



be used for 'any worthwhile purpose to commemorate the happy memories Peter had of the Dunn Rock area'.

Peter's legacy now made this vision of tennis courts and a clubhouse possible.

From that first meeting in Sally's home the Dunn Rock Tennis Club was formed with Sally naturally taking on the position of Treasurer which she held until 1991.

In 1988 Sally offered 4 ha's of land to construct the Tennis Club for excision, to be vested in the Shire of Lake Grace, thus our vision had a location and was built during that year and completed in 1989.

In 1991 the Dunn Rock Tennis Club was officially

opened.

Planning is under way for the Ravensthorpe Crop Updates (scheduled for February 13th) and the GRDC Esperance Port Zone Research Updates, which will be held in Lake King. RAIN will also host a 'Salt Summit' in early 2020. Salinity is an ongoing issue with new expressions erupting throughout the Shire after a series of wet (including flood) then dry years. RAIN, the Ravensthorpe Shire and the Department of Water and Environment Regulation are working on a 'Community Water Supply' funding application to upgrade the Fitzgerald Dam emergency water supply.

On December 2nd 'The Dibbler and The Numbat' children's book will be officially launched in Ravensthorpe. The book was written by Richenda Goldfinch with students of Jerdacuttup Primary School assisting with the illustrations. This project has been funded by the State Natural Resource Management Program WA and RAIN with an

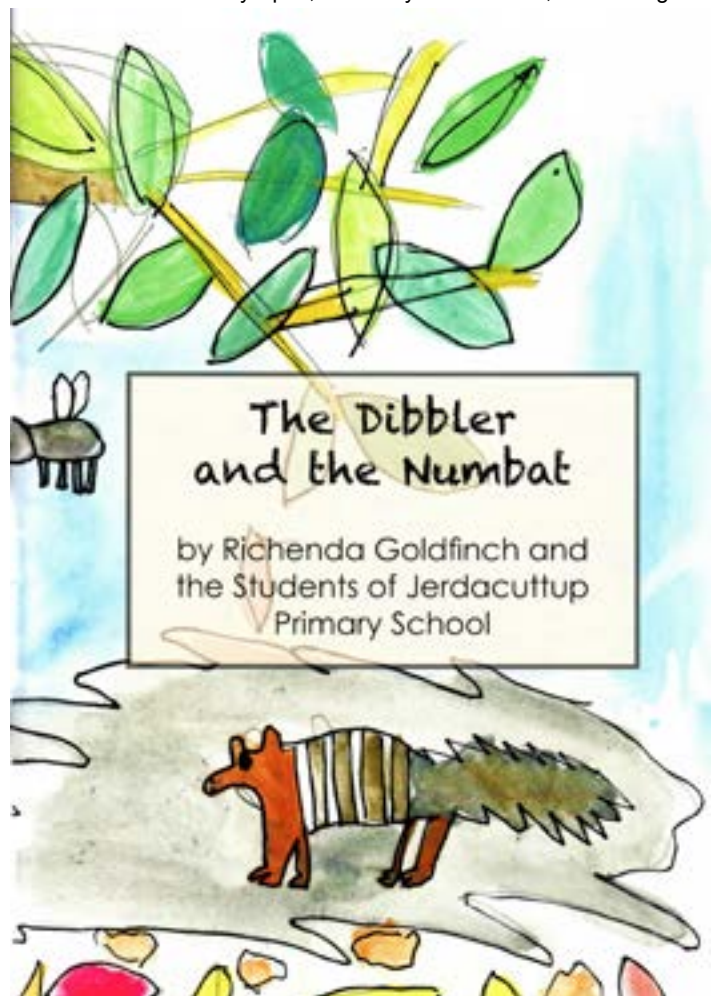
aim to raise awareness of endangered fauna species endemic to our area. Projects like these show the diversity of the RAIN organisation.

Two hectares of weed control works have been undertaken at Dunns Swamp treating both African Boxthorn and Bridal Creeper. These works were funded by South Coast NRM via the Australian Government's National Landcare Program.

RAIN, in collaboration with the Southern Biosecurity Group, has successfully completed the spring release of the Rabbit Calicivirus. A second release will occur in autumn. The extent of Apple of Sodom within the Ravensthorpe Shire (a declared pest weed) has been mapped and a feasibility of eradication report is being written.

Saltbush for 2020 has been ordered. RAIN coordinated the order on behalf of some land managers - the cost is being met by growers.

RAIN received some exciting news, a State NRM Grant came through as successful (well done Jack!) The 'Uncovering



Cocanarup - Conservation, Community & Culture' project involves a habitat survey of the proposed reserve in the Cocanarup - Kundip area and raising awareness of the natural asset through community engagement events.

RAIN will be coordinating some Hopetoun Summer Festival activities including a guided walk in the national park and some educational beach activities - we hope to see you on the coast!

With the quick harvest, growers may be able to

enjoy their summer holidays a bit sooner. Most have destocked due to drought and dams have already been cleaned out given the two year dry spell. We'd like to thank our committee and members for their ongoing support and wish everyone a relaxing summer break with loved ones.

Madeline after a year's break and she hadn't forgotten how to get her pinkies near the kitty.

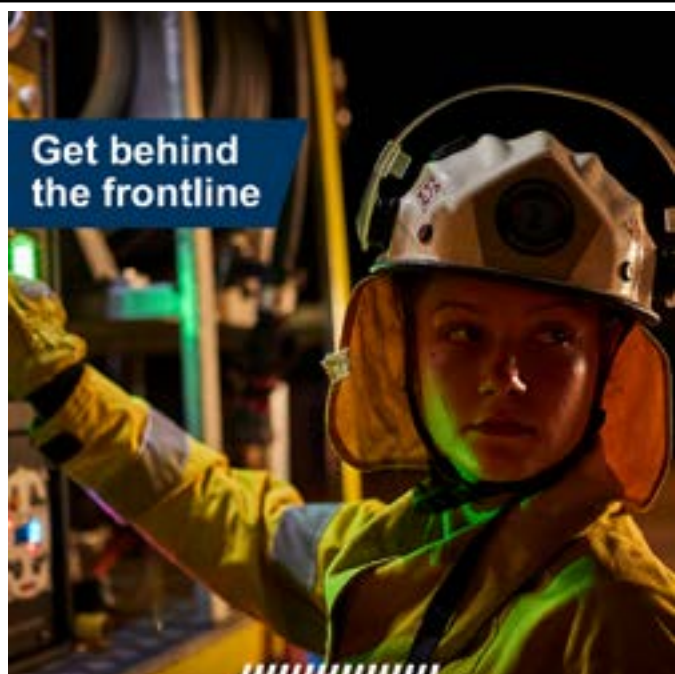
